Olin Browne /USA (April 22, 1959)	3	0	0	7	Assistant Captain on 2008 U.S. Ryder Cup team.	PGA TOUR Comeback Player of the Year in 2005... First PGA TOUR title came after 14 years as a professional.
Bob Tway /USA (May 4, 1959)	8	0	1986 PGA Championship	11	0	PGA of America's Player of the Year in 1986... PGA TOUR's Comeback Player of the Year in 1995... Three-time All-American at Oklahoma State and a member of two national championship teams.
Peter Senior /AUS (July 31, 1959)	0	26	0	26	1994, 1996 International Presidents Cup Team	Led the Australian Tour's Order of Merit in 1987, 1989 and 1993.
Keith Clearwater /USA (September 1, 1959)	2	0	0	2	0	1987 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year... Member of winning 1981 NCAA Championship team at Brigham Young.
Tom Pernice, Jr. /USA (September 5, 1959)	2	0	0	2	0	Two-time All-America selection at UCLA and the Pac-10 Player of the Year in 1981.
David Frost /RSA (September 11, 1959)	10	12	0	22	1994, 1996 International Presidents Cup Team	Holds PGA TOUR's all-time 72-hole putting record with 92 total putts at the 2005 MCI Heritage... Represented South Africa nine times in the Dunhill Cup and won in consecutive years with Ernie Els (1997) and Retief Goosen (1998).

Fred Couples /USA (October 3, 1959)	15	15	1992 Masters Tournament, 1984 and 1996 PLAYERS Championship	36	1989, 1991, 1993, 1995, 1997 United States Ryder Cup team; 1994, 1996, 1998, 2005 United States Presidents Cup team and Captain of the 2009 U.S. Presidents Cup squad.	Two-time PGA TOUR Player of the Year... Winner of Vardon Trophy in 1991 and 1992... Winner of the PGA TOUR's Arnold Palmer Award for leading money-winner in 1992.
Tommy Armour III /USA (October 8, 1959)	2	1	0	8	0	Set PGA TOUR's 72-hole numerical scoring record when he shot 26-under 254 to win the 2003 Valero Texas Open... Won both of his Nationwide Tour titles in consecutive weeks in 1994... Grandson of World Golf Hall of Famer Tommy Armour.
