Weather: Cloudy skies with highs in the 60s and winds S at 10-15 mph.

Summary: Rod Pamplung tied the lowest round of the day with a 6-under 66 to win the 2021 Boeing Classic by one stroke over Tim Herron, Billy Mayfair and Jim Furyk.

Rod Pamplung, 68-70-66 -204 (-12)

- After eagling No. 1 and birdying Nos. 2, 7 and 9, Pamplung finished his round with three birdies and two bogeys on the back nine en route to carding 12-under 204 and his first victory on PGA TOUR Champions.
 - Pamplung's 6-under 66 ties the lowest round of the day.
- Pamplung finished the tournament ranking second in the field in driving distance (310.2).
- He became the first player outside of the top-10 after the second round (T12) to come back and win the tournament.
- Making his 28th start since joining PGA TOUR Champions in 2019, Pamplung has seven top-10 finishes. His best finish before today was T3 (2020 Cologuard Classic).
- With his win, Pamplung becomes the sixth different player from Australia to win on PGA TOUR Champions. Australians Bruce Crampton (20), Graham Marsh (6), David Graham (5), Rodger Davis (1) and Bruce Devlin (1) have combined for 33 wins on PGA TOUR Champions.
- Pamplung owns three wins on the PGA TOUR.

Tim Herron, 69-69-67– 205 (-11)

- Herron carded one eagle, five birdies and two bogeys to post 11-under 205 and a share of second place at the Boeing Classic.
 - This is the second time Herron has carded three rounds in the 60s (2021 Shaw Charity Classic).
 - Herron's final round today marked his seventh consecutive subpar round on the Champions Tour.
- Herron's second place is his best finish since joining PGA TOUR Champions in 2020.
- Today's finish moves him from No. 47 to No. 36 on the Charles Schwab Cup leaderboard.
- During the third round, Herron led the field in greens in regulation (15 of 18).
- This was Herron's 26th start on PGA TOUR Champions. After today's conclusion, he has one runner-up finish and 3 top-10s.
- After joining the PGA TOUR in 1995, he won four tournaments (1996 Honda Classic, 1997 Valero Texas Open, 1999 Arnold Palmer Invitational, 2006 Charles Schwab Cup Challenge) and recorded 59 top-10 finishes.

Billy Mayfair, 66-70-69 – 205 (-11)

- Mayfair made five birdies and two bogeys in his final round at the Boeing Classic to card 11-under 205 and finish T2.
 - This is Mayfair's fourth runner-up finish while on PGA TOUR Champions.
 - Mayfair carded a total of 19 birdies, the second-most during the 2021 Boeing Classic.
- With today's finish, Mayfair jumps from No. 52 to No. 41 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- Making his fifth start at the Boeing Classic, Mayfair's best finish was T3 (2017). Today's 3-under 69 is his 9th round in the 60s at this event (14 rounds).
- This is Mayfair's 27th start of the season on PGA TOUR Champions and has three top-10 finishes (T9, 2021 Chubb Classic; 5, 2021 Shaw Charity Classic; T2 Boeing Classic). He joined PGA TOUR Champions in 2016.
- Mayfair won five times on the PGA TOUR, including twice in both 1995 and 1998.

Jim Furyk, 68-67-70 – 205 (-11)

- Furyk carded three birdies on the front nine before bogeying No. 17 en route to posting 11-under 205 and a share of second place in his first appearance at the Boeing Classic.
- This is Furyk's second runner-up finish this season. His last came at the 2020 TimberTech Championship.
- With Furyk's second place finish, he moves from No. 3 to No. 2 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- Making the 18th start of his rookie season on PGA TOUR Champions, Furyk has won three events (2021 U.S. Senior Open Championship, 2020 The Ally Challenge, 2020 PURE Insurance Championship). He has 11 top-10s and has never finished outside of the top 20 on the Champions Tour.
- Furyk owns 17 PGA TOUR victories and won the FedExCup in 2010. He is the only player in PGA TOUR history with two sub-60 rounds (58, 2016 Travelers Championship, R4; 59, 2013 BMW Championship, R2).

Other Notes

- Seattle native **Fred Couples** carded 1-under 212 for T26 and finished his final round by eagling No. 18.
- **Jerry Kelly** finished T11 after recording 7-under 209 and enters his seventh week leading the Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- Rookie **Ernie Els** carded an even-par 72 for T11 in his final round of his first appearance at the Boeing Classic. He recorded the most eagles (2) of the tournament.

- Four players recorded 6-under 66 for the lowest round of the day: **Alex Cejka, Brian Mogg, Rod Pampling** and **Ken Tanigawa**.
- Starting on the back nine, 2019 Defending Champion **Brandt Jobe** eagled No. 12 and birdied Nos. 13-15 to finish T26 4-under 212.
- Two-time Boeing Classic winner (2010, 2016) **Bernhard Langer** finished T18 after recording 6-under 210 in his 13th appearance at this tournament.
- There are six past Boeing Classic winners in the field this week.
