Woody Austin, 66-68 - 134 (-10)

- Austin sits in first place entering the final round after recording one birdie and one bogey on the front nine and four birdies on the back en route to 4-under 68.
- His 14 total birdies match the most birdies recorded throughout rounds one and two.
 - This is the fourth time during his PGA TOUR Champions career Austin has led/co-led entering the final round.
 - o 2019 SAS Championship (finished T3)
 - o 2020 Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai (finished T9)
 - 2020 SAS Championship (finished T4)
- With a win on Sunday, Austin would snap a 1,035-day winless streak on PGA TOUR Champions dating back to his win at the 2018 Dominion Energy Charity Classic.
- Austin has played the Boeing Classic six times and recorded his best finish T2 in 2016.
- Making his 27th start of the season on PGA TOUR Champions, Austin has one runner-up finish (2020 Cologuard Classic) and eight top-10s.

• Austin, who joined the Champions Tour in 2014, owns four victories (2016 Cologuard Classic; 2016 Mitsubishi Electric Classic, 2016 Bass Pro Shops Legends of Golf, 2018 Dominion Energy Charity Classic).

Jim Furyk, 68-67 – 135 (-9)

- Furyk carded six birdies and bogeyed No. 12 en route to posting 5-under 67 and holds a share of second place entering the final round.
- Furyk will play in the last group of the final round for the fourth time this season.
 - 2020 The Ally Challenge (Won)
 - 2020 TimberTech Championship (finished T2)
 - 2021 U.S Senior Open Championship (Won)
- With a win on Sunday, Furyk would be the first player to win four tournaments this season and first since 2017 when Scott McCarron won four and Bernhard Langer won seven.
 - Furyk is the first three-time winner this season on PGA TOUR Champions. He won the 2021 U.S. Senior Open Championship and each of his first two starts (2020 The Ally Challenge, 2020 PURE Insurance Championship).
- Making the 18th start of his rookie season on PGA TOUR Champions, Furyk has won three events (2021 U.S. Senior Open Championship, 2020 The Ally Challenge, 2020 PURE Insurance Championship). He has 10 top-10s and has never finished outside of the top 20 on the Champions Tour.
- Furyk owns 17 PGA TOUR victories and won the FedExCup in 2010. He is the only player in PGA TOUR history with two sub-60 rounds (58, 2016 Travelers Championship, R4; 59, 2013 BMW Championship, R2).

Colin Montgomerie, 68-67 – 135 (-9)

- Montgomerie posted five birdies en route to a bogey-free 5-under 67. He has played bogey-free his last 33 holes and holds a share of second place entering the final round.
- This is the seventh time Montgomerie has entered the final round in second place, most recently at the 2020 Bridgestone SENIOR PLAYERS Championship.
- Montgomerie will play in the last group of the final round for the second time this season.
 - 2020 SAS Championship (finished 2nd)
- This is his sixth appearance at the Boeing Classic. His best finish was fifth place in 2017 when he carded 15-under 201.
- With a win on Sunday, Montgomerie will post his first victory of the 2020-21 wraparound season and first since the 2019 Invesco QQQ Championship.
- Making his 28th start this season, Montgomerie has posted three top-10 finishes and his best finish was second at the SAS Championship. He's currently 19th in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- Montgomerie has seven wins on PGA TOUR Champions, the most recent being a playoff victory over Bernhard Langer at the 2019 Invesco QQQ Championship.

Other Notes

- Seattle native **Fred Couples** recorded 3-under 141 and sits T28 entering the final round.
- Charles Schwab Cup leader Jerry Kelly recorded 3-under 69 and enters the final round T4 with Brett Quigley, Tim Petrovic, Glen Day and Billy Mayfair.
- First-round co-leader **Ernie Els** carded 1-under 71 and sits T9 entering the final round. He has recorded the most eagles (2) of the tournament.
- Stephen Ames carded the day's best round, a 6-under 66, and improved from T33 to T9.
- **Vijay Singh** sits T12 after birdying Nos. 2-5, matching his consecutive birdie streak set at the 2021 Principal Charity Classic.
- Two-time Boeing Classic winner (2010, 2016) **Bernhard Langer** sits T12 after recording six birdies and two bogeys for 6-under 138 in his 13th appearance at this tournament.

- John Huston withdrew prior to the start of the second round with an injury.
- There are six past Boeing Classic winners in the field this week. Here is where they stand after 36 holes.
