Things to Know

- **Stewart Cink** defeats **Miguel Ángel Jiménez** with a birdie on the first playoff hole (No. 18) at the 21st Boeing Classic, securing his fifth win of the 2026 season and becoming the first player with five victories in a single season on PGA TOUR Champions since Steve Stricker in 2023.

Stewart Cink, 68-71-65 – 204 (-12)

- Closed with 7-under 65, then defeated Jiménez with a birdie at the par-5 18th on the first playoff hole.
 - Carded eight birdies against a lone bogey Sunday after beginning the final round four strokes back in a tie for 10th
- 53-year-old secures his fifth win of the 2026 season in his 14th start, and his ninth win on PGA TOUR Champions in his 50th start.
- Marks his third playoff win of his PGA TOUR Champions career.
 - Previous instances: 2025 Insperity Invitational; 2025 The Ally Challenge
 - His other six victories have come by two-or-more strokes
- Only playoff win in his PGA TOUR career came at the 2009 Open Championship (defeated Tom Watson)
- Becomes the first player on PGA TOUR Champions to win five times in a single season since Steve Stricker in 2023 (six wins)
- Previous wins in 2026:
 - Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai (Jan. 22-24)
 - Hoag Classic (March 27-29)
 - Senior PGA Championship (April 16-19)
 - Regions Tradition (April 30-May 3)
- Avenges last year's runner-up finish at The Club at Snoqualmie Ridge, where he held the 36-hole lead, and snaps the tournament's run of five consecutive international champions.

Other Notes

- **Miguel Ángel Jiménez** (2nd) forced the playoff with 8-under 64, playing the back nine in 8-under 28, setting a tournament 9-hole record, and birdieing his final six holes. The 62-year-old 2022 Boeing

Classic champion led the field with 20 birdies for the week and jumps from No. 12 to No. 8 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.

- Denmark's **Søren Kjeldsen** (3rd) carded a bogey-free 4-under 68 to finish solo third at 11-under 205, moving from No. 20 to No. 14 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings, his 2026 season best finish (previous best 2026 finish: 4th / Regions Tradition).
- Seven players shared fourth at 10-under 206: **Ernie Els**, **David Toms**, **George McNeill**, **Fred Couples**, **Jerry Kelly**, **Steve Flesch** and **Steven Alker**.
- World Golf Hall of Fame member **Ernie Els** (T4) matched the day's low round with a bogey-free, 8-under 64, climbing 53 spots after opening the week T57.
- Seattle native **Fred Couples** (T4) closed with 3-under 67 to finish fourth in his hometown event at age 66, jumping 20 spots in the Charles Schwab Cup standings (No. 79 to No. 59).
- 54-hole leader **Steven Alker** (T4) closed with 1-under 71 and falls to 6-for-14 converting the lead/co-lead entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions.
- First-round leader **Rory Sabbatini** (T14) carded an even-par 72 to finish 6-under in his tournament debut.
- Four players went bogey-free Sunday: Kjeldsen (68), Els (64), **Steve Allan** (68) and **Joe Durant** (69)
